Island Timberlands Continues Generous Tradition with United Way

Since 2007, Island Timberlands has contributed a total of \$12,000 to support United Way's efforts to address the root causes of social issues.

Without community heroes like Island Timberlands, United Way could not provide support to the 33 life-changing programs that give hope to 11,100 children, seniors and adults in the Central Island. Among many other benefits, the monies raised by United Way will match 63 vulnerable kids with mentors who are positive role models; provide over 1,300 children and youth with support and education around witnessing abuse; serve weekly lunches to 135 seniors, students and adults with low incomes; and offer restorative justice to 532 offenders, victims and other participants.

Island Timberland's donations to United Way continue their generous tradition of giving back to the many Island communities in which they operate.

According to Laura Heikkila, United Way's Campaign and Community Impact Associate, donations from local companies are crucial to the organization's Community Campaign. "Island Timberlands' yearly donations make a big difference. They directly benefit people from all walks of life who need help either during a crisis, like the death of a loved one, or because of chronic poverty or health issues. We couldn't help all the people we are able to touch without the contributions from Island Timberlands and other local companies."
