

TD Canada Trust Partners with United Way to Gift Student Backpacks

Nanaimo, BC – December 16, 2014 – In December, TD Canada Trust worked with United Way Central and Northern Vancouver Island to hand out 15 new backpacks full of school supplies to two of United Way's Community Partners.

At this time of the year, most students are excited about the holidays and not many want to think yet about their return to school in January. And, for some students, returning to school after the holidays is especially difficult because, unlike all the other kids, they do not have new clothing or new supplies to show their friends.

This year, TD Canada Trust wanted to help change that situation for some students by giving them backpacks full of school supplies before the holidays. To help them reach students in need, they partnered with United Ways across B.C. including United Way Central and Northern Vancouver Island (United Way CNVI).
